Facilities Cleaning, Sanitizing, Disinfecting and Ventilation

Requirement(s)

Cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and ventilating learning spaces, surfaces, and any other areas used by students (i.e., restrooms, drinking fountains, hallways, and transportation)

Strategies, Policies and Procedures

Lakeside Mobile Support Vehicles and all materials used by staff or student will be sanitized, disinfected, and ventilated each day. High touch areas will be disinfected daily with approved CDC disinfectants. Vehicle windows will stay open as feasible during the day. All CDC protocols will be followed. Staff and students will have access to disinfectants in each vehicle and meeting places. Signs will encourage frequent use of disinfectants. Staff will be trained on cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and ventilation protocols appropriate to their role. Vice President of Facility Management will train Mobile Support staff on disinfecting Mobile Support vehicles, and proper cleaning for student areas. Director of Technology will train staff on disinfection of computers, Chromebooks, and other IT devices.

Social Distancing and Other Safety Protocols

Requirement(s)

Learning space occupancy that allows for social distancing among students and staff throughout the day, to the maximum extent feasible

Hygiene practices for students and staff including the manner and frequency of hand-washing and other best practices

Posting signs, in highly visible locations, that promote everyday protective measures, and how to stop the spread of germs

Handling sporting activities consistent with the CDC Considerations for Youth Sports for physical education classes

Limiting the sharing of materials among students

Limiting the number of individuals in classrooms and other learning spaces, and interactions between groups of students

Strategies, Policies and Procedures

Students will be seen 1:1 by Mobile Support staff. Staff are encouraged to use outdoor spaces (parks, cafes, student's lawns or decks if seen at the home, etc.) as weather and practical concerns permit. Staff and students will follow social distancing protocols and sanitation of tables, pens, pencils, calculators, laptops, textbooks, fidgets, phones, etc. Staff and students will be encouraged to disinfect and wash frequently during the school day. Student transportation will include one student per Mobile Support vehicle at a time. Students will sit in the back seat, passenger-side, to ensure social distancing and to mitigate the spread. All staff and students who participate In-Person learning will observe the protocols outlined in this document. All Mobile Support staff and students will be trained on social distancing and healthy hygiene protocol before the first day of In-Person learning. Training will include preventative measures that should be implemented at home as well as instructions on protocol during In-Person sessions. Preparedness will be evaluated before permission to participate In-Person will be given.

Monitoring Student and Staff Health

Requirement(s)

Monitoring students and staff for symptoms and history of exposure

Isolating or quarantining students, staff, or visitors if they become sick or demonstrate a history of exposure

Returning isolated or quarantined staff, students, or visitors to school

Notifying staff, families, and the public of school closures and within-school- year changes in safety protocols

Other monitoring and screening practices

Strategies, Policies and Procedures

Staff and students will be trained on social distancing and healthy hygiene protocol before the first day of In-Person learning. Training will include preventative measures that should be implemented at home as well as instructions on protocol while with Mobile Support staff. Before entering a Lakeside Mobile Support vehicle, Lakeside building, or student home, every Mobile Support staff member, student, and any of a student's family members present in the home during an in-home session, will, on a daily basis, be asked to complete a questionnaire and have their temperature taken to screen for Covid symptoms and exposure. A staff member or student who is ill or who needs to isolate or quarantine may only participate in the Mobile Support Program as a Remote-Learning participant until they have been cleared by their healthcare provider, and a member of the Lakeside Mobile Support Covid team receives verification. Students who are uncomfortable participating in In-Person learning may participate as a Remote-Learning participant. The Lakeside Mobile Support Covid Team will regularly communicate and monitor developments with local authorities, employees, and families regarding cases, exposures, and updates to policies and procedures. Should a staff member or student become ill or become exposed, a member of the Lakeside Covid Team will contact the Mobile Support staff members and student as per County guidelines; particularly should there be a revision of this plan.

Requirement(s)

Protecting students and staff at higher risk for severe illness

Use of face coverings (masks) by all staff

Use of face coverings (masks) by all students

Unique safety protocols for students with complex needs or other vulnerable individuals

Strategies, Policies and Procedures

Staff and students will be required to wear face masks during the school day. Staff and students that are at higher risk for severe illness may attend sessions with the Mobile Support Program as a Remote-Learning Instruction participant and will not be expected to attend as an In-Person Learning participant. In the event of assigned staff becoming too ill to perform their individual responsibilities, a qualified substitute will be provided. Special education services will be provided for students with an Individual Education Plan (IEP) and referred for Mobile Support services. Students may remove face coverings when students:

- Eating or drinking when spaced at least 6 feet apart; or
- When wearing a face covering creates an unsafe condition in which to operate equipment or execute a task; or
- At least 6 feet apart during "face-covering breaks" to last no longer than 10 minutes.
